

## SAT or ACT?!?

Most four-year colleges require you to take the SAT or the ACT and will accept either. Your scores are considered as part of admission decisions. Your scores may also determine course placement or be used in academic advising. Scores can also be used to determine eligibility for scholarships, loans, and other forms of financial assistance.

Two-year colleges usually do not require ACT or SAT scores. If you have scores, some schools may use them for academic advising or to determine course placement. If you are thinking of starting at a two-year college and transferring to a four-year college, some four-year colleges may want your scores at transfer time.

It is recommended that you take one of the tests in your junior year (or early in your senior year) while you are studying the type of material that you will find on the tests. If you test twice, colleges will take your highest score. If you test more than twice, they may average the scores.

## A brief comparison of the two tests:

SAT ACT

- > \$49.50 for SAT Test
- \$64.50 for test with a short essay
- ➤ Late registration fee \$30
- Includes scores reported to four colleges (eight with fee waiver) if selected at registration
- \$12 each for additional score reports or reports requested outside registration period. Waiver allows unlimited.
- > Test sections:
  - 50% evidence based reading & writing
  - 50% math (through Algebra 2) with student produced responses
- No penalty for wrong answers

- ➤ \$68.00 for ACT Plus Writing (or \$52.00 for ACT without writing)
- ➤ Late registration fee \$30
- ➤ Includes scores reported to four colleges; additional score reports \$13 each.

- Multiple choice test sections:

English: 75 questions

o Reading: 40 questions

Math: 60 questions

o Science: 40 questions

- No penalty for wrong answers
- You will have seven sub-scores.
