Her leadership extends to serving on various local, regional, and national boards, where she's influenced and co-authored policy and legislation to increase funding and enhance health services, particularly in school settings.

She holds undergraduate and nursing degrees from Oregon and Washington, alongside a Master's in Public Health from Oregon Health Sciences University School of Nursing. She is a 1993 graduate from Clatsop Community College's Nursing Program. 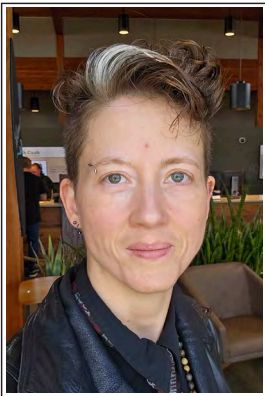
